- 2) **APPROVAL OF MINUTES.** Approved the minutes of a regular city council meeting on February 22, 2022.
- 3) **APPROVAL OF WARRANTS.** Approved City Council, Successor Agency, and Fire Protection District warrants dated 2/28/2022.
- 4) RESOLUTION NO. 2022-8990 AWARDING A FIVE YEAR CONTRACT FOR TRAFFIC SIGNAL AND STREETLIGHT MAINTENANCE SERVICES. Adopted a resolution awarding a five year contract for traffic signal and streetlight maintenance services to Bear Electrical Solutions, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.
- 5) RESOLUTION NO. 2022-8991 ADOPTING FINDINGS PURSUANT TO ASSEMBLY BILL 361 (AB 361) TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY'S LEGISLATIVE BODIES TO CONTINUE TO HOLD TELECONFERENCED/VIRTUAL MEETINGS. Adopted a resolution making findings pursuant to Government Code Section 54953 of the Brown Act, as amended by Assembly Bill 361, and authorizing the continued use of teleconferenced/virtual meetings for all City legislative bodies for another 30 days.
- 6) RESOLUTION NO. 2022-8992 APPROVING A FIVE YEAR CONTRACT WITH THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY SHERIFF FOR THE PROVISION OF POLICE SERVICES IN THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS. Adopted a resolution approving a five year contract with the San Diego County Sheriff for the provision of police services in the City of Marcos. The contract would be effective July 1, 2022 and expire on June 30, 2027.
- 7) RESOLUTION NO. 2022-8993 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS GIVING NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM CONTRACT FOR FIRE MANAGEMENT GROUP EFFECTIVE 7/1/22. Adopted a resolution noting the City's intention to amend the California Public Employees' Retirement System Contract to add optional contract provision Section 20516 (Employees Sharing Additional Cost) for the Fire Management Group which will go into effect July 1, 2022 or as soon as administratively possible.

8) ORDINANCE 2022-1514 – PUBLIC HEARING #4 FOR REDRAWING OF SAN MARCOS CITY COUNCIL MEMBER DISTRICT BOUNDARIES AND INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE. 1. Received a report from staff and the City's redistricting consultant on the redistricting process and permissible criteria to be considered to redraw district boundaries; and 2. Conducted a public hearing to receive public input on district boundaries; and 3. Reviewed and provided feedback on proposed map options; and 4. Selected a preferred map and introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of San Marcos, California Adjusting the Boundaries of City Council Election Districts and Confirming Such Revised Council District Boundaries."

SCOTT SMITH, CITY'S REDISTRICTING CONSULTANT, presented a report on the redistricting efforts and proposed district map.

9) ORDINANCE 2022-1515 – AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING TITLE 9 (PARKS AND RECREATION), CHAPTER 9.04 OF THE SAN MARCOS MUNICIPAL CODE, REGARDING USE OF CLASS 1 AND CLASS 2 E BIKES ON CITY TRAILS, AND UPDATING PROVISIONS RELATING TO PARKS AND PARK HOURS.
